

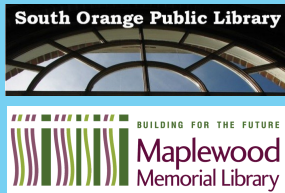
CHOICES

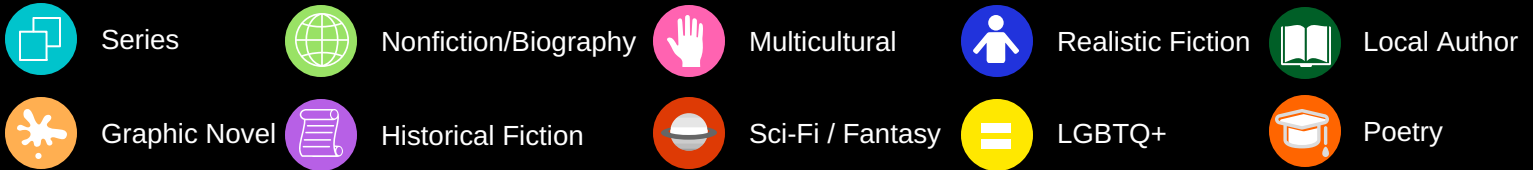
